

TRANSPORTATION

Having access to a means of transportation is an important part of gaining independence. Employment, personal care, social activities and community involvement all require accessibility. So, planning how you will get around is critical.

WHAT OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE

- Vocational rehabilitation driving program
- Medicaid transport Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT)
- Public transportation
- Rideshare
- Uber/Lyft/taxi

WHO CAN ACCESS

All individuals with an identified disability may apply, however, each option has a very specific set of disability eligibility requirements.

HOW TO SIGN UP

Check program requirements

Vocational Rehab: Individuals must be working with OVR to be referred

Medicaid Transport: Must be a Medicaid beneficiary requiring transportation to and from an approved Medicaid Service

Public Transportation: If public transportation (bus system) is available in your area, contact them to ask what disability services are available.

Rideshare: Relies on friends, families, and co-workers

UBER/Lyft/taxi: No prescheduling of services, but can be expensive

Other considerations

- Time required to pre-schedule or modify trips
- Travel times and service availabilities
- Durations of wait times and travel times
