

Question: I'm a senior in high school, and

I've been feeling super overwhelmed trying to figure out what I'm going to do after graduation. How do I even start figuring out what I can do after high school when I feel like everything is up in the air? *Student age 18*

Answer: Transitioning from high school to the next chapter is tough for everyone, and having a disability just adds another layer to that challenge. But here's the good news: you have options!

You don't have to dive straight into a fulltime job or a four-year college right away if that doesn't feel like the right fit. Maybe a gap year to explore your options, try out internships, or even take a few online courses could help you gain clarity. It's okay to take your time and experiment with what feels right for you.

Remember, there's no one-size-fits-all path after high school. What matters is that you take steps toward something that feels right for you and that you're open to adjusting and learning along the way. Keep us posted!


Making the Right Choice!

You can add goals that will help you prepare for your future in your IEP. These goals will help you learn the skills you need to be successful at a job or in a school environment.


