

<u>Reopening State-Operated Area Technology Centers for In-Person</u></u> <u>Instruction</u>

Pursuant to KRS 156.802, the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) Office of Career and Technical Education (OCTE) has responsibility for all administrative functions of the state in relation to the management, control and operation of state-operated secondary area vocational education and technology centers.

The 51 state-operated area technology centers (ATCs), which serve local districts, are commonly referred to as the Kentucky Tech system. To date, during the 2020-2021 academic year, the state-operated ATCs have implemented a non-traditional instruction (NTI) plan based upon the Aug. 10 recommendation of Gov. Andy Beshear for all school districts to suspend in-person instruction until Sept. 28 due to the high number of Kentuckians testing positive for COVID-19. This guidance document is intended to provide an overview of the Kentucky Tech reopening plan for all ATCs, beginning on Sept. 28, 2020.

On Sept. 14, the Kentucky Department for Public Health (DPH) released the COVID-19 Mode of Instruction Metrics for K-12 Education. The Kentucky Tech reopening plan will be based on a localized approach, with the DPH metrics serving as a guidepost for decision-making and implementation of in-person instruction for each ATC. The chart on the following page outlines the expectations for ATCs when determining their reopening plans.

Per the DPH COVID-19 Mode of Instruction Metrics for K-12 Education guidance, the determination of whether schools are opened or closed for in-person instruction for the following school week (Monday) should be determined by the color level of your county at 8 p.m. ET every Thursday as shown on the County Incidence Map found at www.kycovid19.ky.gov. Just as with local districts, this suggests that the status of in-person instructional plans within any given ATC may have the potential for disruption or amendments based upon these metrics at any given time. ATC principals shall report such changes in the status of their plans on a weekly basis to the KDE OCTE.

Given these unknowns, it is the expectation that every ATC instructor and program have a virtual classroom platform planned for the entire 2020-2021 academic year. This ensures that virtual learning can be implemented when necessary and continue as needed, based upon each ATC's respective schedule.

An ATC providing instruction fully via NTI may permit remote work site locations. Otherwise, it is expected that all ATC employees report to the ATC building each work day to fulfill regular work hours. If special work site accommodations are necessary, such accommodations should be



addressed by the employee with the ATC principal, in collaboration with the KDE Division of Human Resource Management.
